OMSs in the United States are members of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS).







They are trained to administer local anesthesia, all forms of sedation and general anesthesia in a safe and cost-effective manner in an office setting.

OMSs are an important link in the referral network for dentists and physicians, working with orthodontists, general dentists, restorative dentists and physicians.
